## CAP. L.

## An Act to Incorporate the City of Sherbrooke.

Assented to 24th December, 1875.

HEREAS the provisions of the Municipal Code do not meet the present requirements of the Town of Sherbrooke:

And whereas it has become necessary that more ample provisions should be made for the internal government of the said Town:

And whereas the inhabitants of said Town are desirous that the same should be constituted a City and have a special act of incorporation; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

The inhabitants of the said Town of Sherbrooke, as hereinafter described, and their successors, shall continue Corporation continued. to be, and are hereby declared to be, a body politic and corporate, by the name of "The corporation of the City of Sherbrooke," and by that name, they and their successors shall have perpetual succession, and shall have power to sue and be sued, to implead and be impleaded in all courts and in all actions, causes, and suits at law whatsoever; and shall have a common seal, with power to alter and modify the same at their pleasure; and shall, General in law, be capable of receiving by donation, of acquiring, powers. holding and parting with any property, real or moveable, for the use of the said city; of becoming parties to any contracts or agreements in the management of the affairs of the said city, and of giving or accepting any notes, bonds, drafts, obligations, judgments, or other instruments or securities for the payment of, or securing the payment of, any sum of money borrowed or loaned, or for the execution of any other duty, right or thing whatsoever; and for borrowing any sum of money required for any purpose within the jurisdiction of the council of said Loan. city, either upon the debentures of the said city, to be is-
