The motion was seconded by Lord George Hamilton, and supported by Sir J. Lawrence, Mr Hornby, and Mr Newdegate. It was met by Mr Goschen, on the part of the Government, with a direct negative, the right honourable gentleman denying the facts stated and the inferences drawn from them. It was likewise opposed by Mr Pease and Mr Fothergill.

On the motion of Mr W. H. Smith, the debate was adjourned.
