instrument available, but rather to carry it with us, and to use it as not abusing it.

And this, as I have said, is what I shall endeavour to do. No one can regret more than myself that the most interesting of all regions of scientific enquiry should happen to be the one in which experiment, or inductive verification, is least of all applicable; but such being the case, we must take the case as we find it, use deductive reasoning where we clearly see that it is the only instrument available, but use it to as limited an extent as the nature of our subject permits.
