Kelley's Brave Boys Win Another Swatting Carnival

Leafs and Hustlers in a Clouting Mood—Toronto Wins 10 to 8—Three Home Runs in One Day.

The Leafs and the Hustlers indulged in another swatting carnival yesterday, and once again the Leafs men came out on top, to the tune of 10 to 8.

Home runs, triples and doubles were common things, and the fans got their fill of extra-base clouting. The Rochester crew outlasted the Leafs, 14 to 12, but the Leafs were always out in front.

The battle started with Quinn, late of the New York Highlanders, and Drucker doing mound duty, but two innings were enough for the tall, fair boy of the Leafs, and he was chased back to first base on a throw from the pitcher, but he was not seriously hurt.

Eddie Holly was the handiest little man with the hickory for the Leafs, and his three hits were the biggest hit collected by any one man on our side. His double in the first inning sent three base-warmer hurrying home. Al Shaw got his fourteenth homer, and Drucker tripled.

Rochester supplied two home runs, a triple and a two-base hit.

Drucker hadn't much to peddle out to the Rochester sluggers while he did duty, and they pounded him for seven hits in two innings. Lush, who relieved him, was much better.

Quinn got off to a bad start, and the Leafs scored enough in the first inning to win any respectable game of ball, crossing the plate no less than seven times. It was a case of hit and run all day. Two walks helped it along. Meyer got on free and O'Hara singled. Shaw fanned and Jordan was walked deliberately. Bradley bounced a hit off Dolan's boots and run No. 1 was in. McConnell singled off Quinn's glove and O'Hara scored. Holly cleared the bases with a double and was out trying to make third on the throw-in. Benis singled and came in on Drucker's triple. A wild pitch let the pitcher score, and the sum total was seven.

Shaw's home run in the second made it eight, and O'Hara's double and singles by Shaw and Bradley counted two more in the fourth, and this proved to be the last of the day.

A triple and a single started Rochester off with one in the first, and they got to Drucker in telling fashion in the second. Three singles, a double and Quinn's home run gave them four counters, and proved to be Drucker's finish.

The Hustlers got one from Lush in the third; he then kept them without scoring until the ninth, and this proved to be the last of the day.
