Mr. Justice MacMahon has rendered the most important judgment delivered at Osgoode Hall for a long time. It is surpon the motion of the plaintiff in Dwyer v. Immediately upon the granting of the injunction order the defendants gave notice of appeal and took the other steps provided for by Rule of Court 1487 (805) to prosecute their appeal. The court holds that this practically nublifies the injunction, because of the far-reaching effect of the words inserted in the rule, viz.: "All further proceedings in the section in the court appealed from shall the sterior"
