The critics of the Chancellor of the Exchequer—brokers and small investors—point out that the loan was worth 3 9-10 per cent., that it was so excellent a thing that every pound should have been kept here; that even if the American offer was accepted it should have been done differently and that to ask for subscriptions to ten millions when five millions were already allotted was rather tricky.
