MISSIONARY LIFE IS DESCRIBED FOR WOMAN'S SOCIETY

Baptist Mission Work Discussed by Gathering.

The second session of the Women's Baptist Home and Foreign Missionary Society of Western Ontario was held yesterday in the Egerton Street Baptist Church. At this session returned missionaries and missionaries on furlough gave word pictures of the Baptist missionary work in India, touching on the customs of the natives and the way with which they are dealt when being taught the Christian faith. They also spoke of the hardships endured by some of the missionaries.
Miss Ellen Preist, a missionary on furlough from Trinity College, explained the work in which she had been engaged, which had been principally among the women's zenanas and caste women. The work of Miss Preist has always been confined to the one place, Funi, and through this she has been able to see the benefit of her work. When she first started in that district there were 65 church members. Miss Preist occupies a lovely bungalow, the money to build which was given by the Baptist women of Ontario. Mention was also made of Miss Gertrude Hulet, who has been out in India for several years, and who has been indefatigable in evangelistic work. Miss Hulet graduated from Trinity College in Medicine, and when leaving Canada left a large practice behind, and is now doing medical work in India as well as missionary work. LATTER DAY SAINTS DEFENDED AT MEETING OF LONDON PRESBYTERY

During the London Presbytery conference yesterday on the "Forward Movement" of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, which was held in the First Presbyterian Sunday School hall, Rev. W. R. McIntosh took exception to the name "Latter Day Saints," which appeared on a chart referred to by one of the speakers as synonymous with the term "Mormon" and standing for a menace to the moral and spiritual welfare of the country, associated as Mormonism is, in the minds of the public, with bigamy. Copies of the charts used yesterday are to be sent out to all the churches for educational purposes.
Mr. McIntosh stated that the sect in this city, known as the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, is made up of earnest, evangelical people, who love the Lord Jesus Christ, ally themselves with all moral reform and welfare movements, and who repudiate Brigham Young, polygamy and the branch of the church of which Joseph N. Smith, who died the other day, was the head.
"We have five people in this city who belong to the reorganized church," he said, "and it seems unfair to class them with the Mormons of Raymond, Alta., and other sections of the west, or the Utah Mormons referred to by the speaker as carrying on propaganda in Toronto."
Rev. J. G. Stuart of this city and Rev. Mr. Galbraith of Thamesford supported the statements of Mr. McIntosh in his suggestion that the name "Latter Day Saints" be changed on the chart to "Mormons" before the charts are sent out. Reference was made by these speakers to the fact that the Latter Day Saints' congregation in this city was the first to offer its church and the service of members as nurses to combat the epidemic some weeks ago.
