ending Nov. 30, no less than \$300,000 was spent at Sydney and Springhill, and the sum of \$135,000 elsewhere, or a total expenditure for the union of \$435,000 in all. For the quarter ending Nov. 30 last, the amount received was \$290,000, giving an increased deficit of \$235,000. On Sept. 1, the union claimed \$627,000 in their treasury, so that if they lost \$235,000 in their hopeless fight with the down-easters, their treasury must be reduced to \$392,000, and if the U. M. W. of America be stubborn enough to keep up the fight, say till spring, their surplus will have entirely disappeared.
