BIGGEST FOR YEAR

Seven Thousand Active Service Men to Take Part—Reviewed by Gen. Logie.

In honor of the visiting 14th Edmonton, Alberta, "Western Scottish" Battalion, a ceremonial route march will be held this afternoon with seven thousand active service troops taking part, including artillery and cyclists.

The first intention was to have a review in the Don Valley, but that idea was abandoned owing to the ground there being broken up.

In today's parade the Western Battalion will be given the place of honor at the head of the infantry. The parade will be the biggest event of the kind witnessed in Toronto for nearly a year.

The head of the main body of troops will pass the Dufferin street gate at 1:00 p.m., and will proceed by way of Dufferin, King, Jarvis, Wellesley and St. Albans, to Queen's Park, thence down University avenue to Queen street, and along Queen to Dufferin street to the camp.
