## STEPHENSON WILL OPPOSE MINISTER

To Fight One of Seatless as Hired Man's Candidate.

Ed Stephenson, 66 Stephenson avenue, Toronto, writes to The World, in part, as follows: "I have decided to announce my candidature against one of the three seatless Ontario cabinet ministers. Their new machine, the 'Ufola,' cracked James Simpson's record. It will crack the Drury and Raney records. Raney is unacceptable to farmers and Labor party. Why should he be forced upon them? It is but right and proper that the people should have a chance to pronounce upon the revolutionary turn of affairs in provincial politics. Has one word been heard about the interests of agricultural laborers? I intend to frankly pose as the hired man's candidate. Then we may hear less about rural depopulation. I am in possession of a number of facts about the Kapuskasing (Keeleus-guessing) colony, which have not yet been brought to light. The present deputy minister of lands and forests should be dismissed. I am opposed to compulsory vaccination. The policy of the new Ontario government is to make the country safe for the American motor trucks. I am for a policy of continued improvement of important highways without sacrificing the farmers' need of good market roads. I believe serious consideration should be given to the removal of the capital of Ontario to a point farther north, and would remove the administration of lands, forests and mines both to, say, North Bay. The coalition have the opportunity to reconstruct their cabinet before it is wrecked and get on with urgent public business. I would be only too glad to see them go under, and nothing is further from my desire."

## WRIT AGAINST CITY

Heavy Damages Asked for Alleged Use of Formula.

A writ has been issued by John Berry against the corporation of the city of Toronto for \$250,000 as damages for information given the city for the purification of its water supply, which information he alleges was used by the city, and for damages for the use of his process, for which Mr. Berry claims he holds a patent, No. 136,775, issued by the Dominion in November, 1911.

He also asks for an injunction restraining the city from further use of the process.

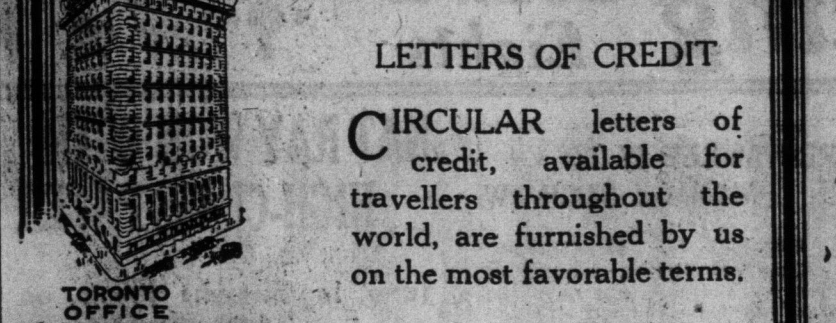
