WHOLESALE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Strawberries—There were only a few Canadian berries shipped in yesterday, and the quality varied, so there was a wide range of prices, most of them selling at from 40c to 60c per box, a few bringing 40c and 50c while some sold at 35c per box. Some of the afternoon shipments did not arrive until five o'clock, which spoiled their sale.

Asparagus was shipped in fairly free quantities this season, and quality brought from \$2.50 to \$3 per 11-qt basket. There was quite a quantity left over from Saturday, which went as low as \$1.50 per 11-qt basket.

Watermelons are coming in freely, but prices keep stationary, at \$1.25 to \$1.75 each.

Cabbages, after being a glut on the market, has been scarce the past few days and prices have advanced.

Cantaloupes—The first car of cantaloupes this season arrived yesterday and to White & Co., Limited, and Chase & Simpson, prices being very much lower.
