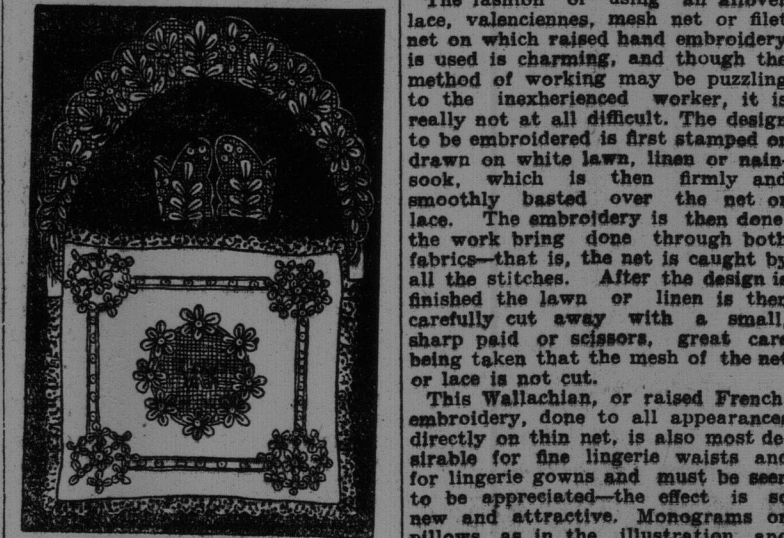
DESIGNS FOR THE HOME NEEDLEWORKERS

Among the novelties offered to needle-workers is a new adaptation of an old and well-known stitch. Wallachian embroidery is one of the most effective styles in the field of needlework and as it is decidedly pretty and easy to do it will without doubt find many admirers.

The sketch shows a buttonhole stitch, slightly slanted toward the petals, so as to turn the corners nicely, the rings being worked in straight, even stitches. The centers of the rings are punched with a still-letto and the needle always put in the hole thus made.

A strand of four or five threads of fine mercerized cotton or one thread of coarse, loosely twisted, luster cotton does excellently for the work, which goes very quickly. These luster or mercerized cottons come in so great a variety of colors and in so many weights that one does not experience the slightest difficulty in ob-

STRIKES

(Ottawa Citizen.)

With the coming of spring there are strikes and rumours of strikes throughout Canada. The miners at Cobalt, or at least some of them, after being kept at work all winter, are striking again when the busy shipping season commences; the longshoremen at ocean ports are talking strikes; mechanics at Brantford are on strike and rioting.

The big Soo steel plant has shut down for lack of orders; the Canadian railways are busy reducing expenses and taking off trains; the passenger traffic of the street railways in the larger cities is reported to be showing a decrease. So is the revenue of the Federal government.

There are not wanting indications that the trade and commerce of the country is in a state of equilibrium. Business in the United States is not recuperating with the facility that was expected when spring opened up. In Canada there are not the unhealthy conditions that precipitated the panic of last autumn across the line, but the business relations throughout the world are now so intimate, as a result of the unparalleled facility for communication in this new century, that no one country can experience a shock to its financial nerves without others being more or less sympathetically affected.

Responsible men of affairs are gravely considering the prospect, not of hard times but at least a recession from the prevailing buoyant prosperity of the past few years. The general feeling is that a good harvest this year will set everything right again. But in the meantime there is a strong disposition to mark time or move cautiously. Above all it is not a time for strikes or industrial disturbances of any sort. An imprudent jarring of conditions might make the difference between holding what we have in the way of prosperity and a recession in trade conditions. It is up to the employer as well as the employee to consider these matters. The wage earner in this country at least has had a fair share of the good things of the past few years. It is his duty to study existing conditions and use prudence and judgment to assist in tiding over a possible period, not of depression, but of possible stagnation.

It is a good time to refrain from strikes, and from demands which may add to the anxiety of the employer at a time when encouragement and loyal support are most necessary. The leaders of labor throughout Canada should take this into their serious consideration. The relations between capital and labor are good. Generally speaking the Canadian wage-earner has been pretty well treated by the Canadian employer. At all times their interests are in a sense identical, just now it should be a case of getting together and standing by until, as we confidently hope, the march of prosperity will be resumed.

Orange Sauce (for puddings, custards, etc.)—In the upper part of a double boiler cream one-fourth of a cup of butter; add the yolks of four eggs, one at a time, and beat in thoroughly; then add one-fourth of a cup of sugar when all are blended; four tablespoonsful of cream and cook over hot water, stirring constantly. When thickened slightly add one-fourth of a cup of orange juice and one teaspoonful of lemon juice.
