

Among the medals that are to be struck in commemoration of the Queen's marriage, are two, the size of the penny and the halfpenny, by Mr. Alfred Stothard. The obverse has the heads of the Queen and Prince Albert, executed in a bold and effective style, with a very happy success in likeness. The reverse has the inscription, "Ob. Nuptias Celebravit, Feb. 10, 1840," within a wreath of oak leaves.

**MARRIAGE IN HIGH LIFE.**—On Tuesday evening, at Kensington Palace, by special licence, Lord Darnley to Miss Gertrude Smyth, sister of Her Royal Highness the Princess of Capua. His Royal Highness the Duke of Sussex gave the fair accomplished bride away, and the chaplain of Lord Darnley officiated at the ceremony.

The *Atromache*, 28, Captain Baynes, is ordered to convey General Sir Lionel Smyth to the Mauritius. Report also that this ship is to convey Frost and his unfortunate companions to New South Wales.

In the House of Lords, the Bishop of Exeter, moved an Address to the Queen, praying her to take measures for preventing the diffusion of blasphemous and immoral doctrines—meaning the doctrines of Robert Owen, and his ideas of socialism.

The Paris Correspondent of the *New York Commercial Advertiser* states that the once splendid Sen of St. Augustine at Bona (Hippoa) is restored by the French, in Algeria, which must eventually, he says, spread the Gospel in one form or other over the whole of the African continent.

It is supposed that the *Liverpool* will not leave England till the 1st of May. She is undergoing repairs for damage done to her stern by the *British Queen* when she came on her next trip with entire new paddles, called the reefing paddles, after a plan of Mr. Hall.

On the 15th Feb. there were 80 ships, 34 banks, 67 brig, and 95 schooners in the harbor of New Orleans.

A man was arrested in New-York, and taken to the police office, for beating his horse unmercifully with a stick of wood. He was required to give bail in \$500, for his future conduct in the treatment of horses.

On James Reed, a thief, recently arrested in New-York, were found, amongst other articles—7 gold watches, 10 pencil cases, 5 gold chains, 3 breast pins, 8 watch keys, 1 gold buckle, 1 spy-glass, 2 opera glasses, \$26 in silver, \$5 in Texas money, 50 gold rings, 7 gold watch chains, and 1 silver watch.

The wife of Enoch Walker, of Newark, Ohio, presented her husband with a pair of twin boys on the 15th Feb., being the third pair since their marriage, which was Jan. 1, 1837. All the children are healthy and promising, and all boys except one.

Two Scholarships will be offered to general competition in the College on Wednesday, June the 24th, at ten in the forenoon.

The one is proposed to candidates who have been already matriculated. They will be examined in Xenophon's Anabasis, Horace, English and Latin Composition, Ancient History and Geography, the first six books of Euclid, the first part of Algebra, and the elements of Trigonometry.

The other is proposed to such as shall not have been matriculated; who will be examined in the first six books of Homer's Iliad, Cicero's Commentaries, the principles of Greek and Latin Grammar, English History, Vulgar and Latin Fractions, and the first four books of Euclid.
