

GERMAN BASE AT JAVAStores of Arms and Ammunition,  
Purchased in East, Said to Have  
Been Shipped to BataviaSan Francisco, June 29.—That the  
Germans are planting a military base  
on the Dutch island of Java, under the  
nose of England's largest colonial pos-  
session, to foster a revolution in India  
and are supplementing this with a se-  
cret naval and submarine base at Batavia  
to prey upon the shipping of the allies  
is a story told here.The purchase of enormous stores of  
arms and ammunition, the shipment of  
some of these in Dutch steamers to Ba-  
tavia, and the mysterious disappearance of  
the rest are one feature.With the arrival of the Japanese steam-  
er Mavrick at Hilo, Hawaii, there was  
cleared up it is thought, the mystery of  
the destination of another shipment of  
arms and ammunition which the steam-  
er Annie Larsen carried out of San  
Diego several months ago.This shipment was purchased for the  
Mexican forces, it is said, at the time,  
but the Annie Larsen ran to Socorro Is-  
land, off Lower California, and there  
transferred the cargo to the Mavrick.Further confirmation is given to the story  
by the arrival in San Francisco of many  
Hindoo natives, expressing friendship  
for Germany, the presence here of a  
Hindoo revolutionist paper believed to  
have support of the Germans, and the  
warnings of the British Admiralty to  
merchants to beware of the Mavrick.Lieutenant Ter Porter, aviator and  
officer in the Dutch East Indian army,  
with headquarters in Batavia, arrived  
here today to close contracts for \$1,000,  
000 worth of rifles, machine guns, ac-
