KLUX KLAN MAN  
HELD FOR MURDER

Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 6.—The Fulton county grand jury today returned an indictment for murder against Philip E. Fox, publicity man of the Ku Klux Klan, who late yesterday shot and killed W. S. Colburn, attorney for the Simmons faction of the organization. Fox, who came to Atlanta from Dallas, Texas, with Imperial Wizard H. W. Evans, is held in the Fulton county jail.

Under the indictment, Fox will have to stand trial for his life. Solicitor John A. Boykin will have charge of the prosecution for the state. The name of the counsel for Fox had not been announced this afternoon.

SAYS ONTARIO TO  
VOTE WET SOON

Toronto, Nov. 6.—"It shows that the west is now thinking seriously on the liquor question and if Ontario gets a chance it will do the same by a greater proportional majority," declared J. A. McCausland, M. L. A., a prominent advocate of Government control of liquor today in discussing the result of the referendum in Alberta. "Can anyone imagine that with Quebec, Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia in the wet column, that it has not been driven into people's heads that the O. T. A. is an absurd act. It only requires a vote and the extreme temperance people will be swept out of existence."

"Do you intend to demand a referendum?" he was asked.

"Undoubtedly," replied Mr. McCausland.
