ARMY MEN ARE INDICTED IN \$100,000 FRAUD

Ex-Major Evans and ex-Captain Klingner Accused—25 Others Said to be Involved—Loss in Motor Car Sale.

Baltimore, Oct. 11.—A fraud against the Government amounting to \$100,000 was said to have been disclosed when two former army officers were indicted for the larceny of two automobiles. The case is declared to involve twenty-five or thirty other officers, some of them still in the service. It is said that big bribes were worked in connection with the sale of automobiles at Camp Holabird.

The men against whom indictments were returned by the Federal Grand Jury, accusing them specifically of stealing two automobiles, are former Major Ralph S. Evans, of Baltimore, and former Captain Paul F. Klingner of Atlantic, Ga.

The discovery of the fraud was made by Government officials. During the trial of army equipment that followed the end of the war, approximately 15,000 automobiles were sold at auction on the grounds of Camp Holabird.
