Such prices are sufficiently low to give some basis to the statement that "the price of wool has nothing whatever to do with the price of clothes." In fact, this has been the case for many months. If there is anything in the price of the raw product, the man on the street should be able to obtain the low-priced clothing he is looking for. It is unusually estimated that there is, approximately, a pound of scoured wool to the yard of cloth, and on such a basis, allowing today's prices for the best wool, the value of the raw product in the finished garment would only be \$1 per yard or at the most \$3.50 for the very best suiting that money will buy. In average suitings the value to the yard would be 60c to 75c, or \$2.10 to \$2,60 per suiting.


