LOCAL NEWS

At a meeting of the citizens' committee held last evening in Odd Fellows Hall, Union street, with President Campbell in the chair. The attendance was very good, a large number of delegates being present. An informal meeting of the board of health was held yesterday afternoon for the purpose of verifying the doings of the committee appointed in connection with the opening of the emergency hospital and to discuss general business. A resolution was passed to the effect that all patients who wished to be admitted to the Emergency Hospital must be passed by the doctor of the board of health. There were several new cases of influenza reported yesterday.

HOUSE BURNED AT EAST ST. JOHN

A building containing the residence and grocery store of W. Woods, in Edith avenue, East St. John, was burned to the ground last evening. The family were in the city and did not know anything about their misfortune until they returned an hour later yesterday, as well as they could with only a few live embers and charred timbers on the spot where a large two-story house had built a fine two-story house and store. The neighbors were forced to allow the fire to take its course and assisted as well as they could with buckets of water to extinguish the flames. The residence of J. H. MacKenzie, which was near the burning building, was badly scorched, and the glass in the windows facing the fire was knocked out by the tremendous heat. Fortunately the wind was blowing in a northerly direction and this saved the house in the vicinity. So far as could be ascertained last night there is no insurance on the property.
