





Gleaner:-The price of bank logs dominion lands office reports that durjumped \$1 per thousand at Springhill ing last month ninety-six homesteads jumped \$1 per thousand at Springhill on Saturday. Until Saturday prices had been held pretty steadily at \$14 for merchantable spruce and \$10 for hemlock; then Henry McClary, who has been representing Randolph & Baker, St. John, paid as high as \$14.75 per thousand for merchantable spruce and \$11 for some hemlock. Lumbermen point out that the cost of the logs by the time they reach St. John is increased from \$1.65 to \$1.75 over and above the price paid at Springhill.
