in one with the back of the coat, extending over the front to simulate the ragian outline.

Serze, polo cloth, broadcloth and zibeline are favored materials for the model shown here. It is trimmed with two large buttons of its own material. To make the coat required 2 yards of 54-inch material for average size. For the largest size ¾ of a yard extra material will be needed.

The front and back (including cape), being the largest parts of the pattern, must be provided for first. After folding the material these parts are laid on a lengthwise thread. In the remaining space the front facing, collar facing and collar sections may be arranged.

Forming dart at upper edge of the front is the first step in making. This should be stitched and pressed carefully. Close shoulder seam of front and back (indicated by single and double notches) from neck edge to extension. Close under-arm seam (indicated by triple notches) from extension to lower edge. Bring single large "O" perforation at lower edge of cape to corresponding large "O" perforation at under-arm seam in front section and
