WINNIPEG, Sept. 28.—There was quiet trading in options, with prices stronger for all months. The opening figures were 1/4c to 1/2c higher, and business was transacted around the high points. October closed 1/4c higher, November 1/2c lower, and December 1/4c higher, with May unchanged.

Montreal Grain and Produce.

MONTREAL, Sept. 28.—There was a good demand for Manitoba siding wheat from foreign buyers, but cables were all weak and the price bid for the crop were from 1/4c to 1/2c per bushel below cost, based on the present market rates for October month. The open market was unchanged, supplies being scarce and prices strong under the market. Flour is steady and fairly active. Butter strong and prices advanced under a good demand. Receipts for the week were 1,370 packages, against 1,000 a year ago. Cheese is quiet and easy, but there is no change in prices. Receipts for week were 1,584 boxes, against 1,000 a year ago. Eggs active and firm. Receipts for week, 400 cases, against 370 a year ago.
