AN ACT RESPECTING STAMP DUTIES.

[Passed September 7th, 1914.] BE it enacted by the Governor, the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows:

1. From and after the com-mencement of this Act there shall be paid for the use of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successore, upon the several instruments mentioned in the Schedule hereto, the several duties in the said Schedule specified. 2. No such instrument excented

4.—Chartet Parties by the Charter at the commencement of this Act in this Colony, or relating wherever executed to any property situate or to any matter or thing done or to be done in this Colony whall, except in criminal proceedings, be pleaded or given in evidence or admitted to be good, useful or a silable in law or equity unless it is duly stamped in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
3. Nothing is this Act shall apply to any Bank note payable to bester or on demand, issued or circulated by any Bank doing business in the Colony.
