

INDIANS ON THE WAR PATH.

A REPORTED MASSACRE FROM NORTHERN MEXICO. BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Oct. 5.—John A. Parson, an American who for two years has been engaged in mining business near Matamoros, in the State of Hidalgo, Mexico, arrived here yesterday and brings information of an Indian outbreak in the district of Matamoros, in which 200 people were massacred, including men, women and children.

The colonists have appealed to the government and several battalions of troops are on the way to the scene of trouble from Pachuca.
