Broughton Brandenburg, Magazin Writer, Collapses When Sentenced.

New York, March 4. - Broughton Brandenburg, magazine writer, was convicted of forgery here yesterday and was sentenced by Judge Swann to not less than two years nor more than four years in Sing Sing.

Brandenburg was convicted of having passed a forged cheque. When arrested he forfeited his bail but was recaptured in Hoboken.

In the last national campaign Brandenburg sold what purported to be a letter the late President Cleveland wrote denouncing William J. Bryan, and the Republicans used it as a campaign document until it was pronounced a forgery. Brandenburg was acquitted of the charge of having forged this letter. When he was sentenced Brandenburg collapsed.
