## Recipes

WHAT TO MAKE WITH PEANUTS

BROWNED PEANUT HASH. - Run beanuts through a food chopper brilliant coloring do not harmonize The choosing of standard styles and cut fine one cupful each of boil-ed potatoes and bread crumbs. Mix Of course, by this it is sweet fat in a frying pan; add the missable but desirable.

PEANUT-BUTTER CROQUETTES. -To two cupfuls of cold boiled rice add two rounding tablespoonfuls of peanut butter, one beaten egg and easoning of salt and paprika. Make into eroquettes; roll in egg and erumbs and fry in deep, hot

PEANUT IRISH STEW .- Slice thin six large onions and cube an equal neasure of Irish potatoes. Boil in two quarts of salted water until the potatoes are half done; then add half a cupful of finely cut roasted peanuts, and cook until the vegetables are tender. When ready to serve, add half a cupful of peanuts eut into halves.

BARED PEANUTS. - Shell unroasted peanuts and pour upon them boiling water, letting them stand until the skins are easily removed. Place a heaped pint of these in a bean pot with two scant quarts of cold water and let come gradually to the boiling point. Then season well with paprika and salt; cover and bake slowly until thoroughly soft, juicy and mealy, which requires about eight hours.
