THE GAY MUSICIAN

BRILLIANT SUCCESS

Opening Performance Much

Appreciated by Large Audience

Catching Music and

Brilliant Costumes.

At the Opera House last evening the Gay Musician Company began a four night engagement before an audience that practically filled the theatre. Apparently St. John people have been anxiously waiting for something bright and lively to relieve the monotony of a rather dull season, for all were eager to enjoy to the utmost the entertainment provided. And the warm reception accorded the players undoubtedly proved an incentive to them to give of their best. The show went with a snap and a swing from start to finish, and an entirely satisfied audience went home at the close.

Like all musical comedies, the Gay Musician has no plot worthy of the name. The connected story is merely a sketch on framework on which musical and other features are hung. As an organization the company is lacking in high class soloists, but is particularly strong in its chorus, and the principals make up in pleasing stage presence and vivacity what they might otherwise lack in voice. The music on the whole is of a class difficult to render in a satisfactory manner, although there are several numbers which cling to the memory.

"Lovebirds" is the catchy air, and will be whistled about St. John streets hereafter.

Two or three of the comedy numbers made instant hits with the audience and "Run Run Tiddle" by Mr. Lyons and chorus brought down the house.

The dialogue is bright, humorous and without the least hint of coarseness; the players in all the leading parts are capable; the costumes are rich and effective; the settings good, and there is an evident desire to please which engages at once the hearty sympathy of the audience.

"The Gay Musician" will be heard again tonight. It is fully deserving of another crowded house, and will no doubt, enjoy generous patronage.

There was a lively shakedown in the Marathon ranks yesterday when five players were released. These were Ramsay, Duffey, Berran, Barry and Cannon. Ramsay asked for his release as he wished to accept a position on the New Waterford team in Cape Breton, the same team on which Jack Copeland is playing shortstop.

There was little fault to find with any of those released and if the team was not above strength now it is probable that some at least would have been retained. This is especially true of Duffey and Barry, who are recognized as classy pitchers despite the fact that they have been in the hard luck since their advent here. But they are expensive and with Sweet, Winter, Tarbell and Woods to depend on, the Greeks are well supplied in the box department. The same applies to Cannon on the receiving end, as Connolly and Nelson are well fixed there. Ramsay has played good ball and is popular but with Pryor, Winter and Pinkerton in the outfield, he is hardly needed. The infield will now consist of Gansel, Pinkerton, Pryor and Dolan, with Joe Tarbell's brother, Riley and Lynch for use in the outfield when necessary.

This selection will probably give the Marathons the strongest team in the league and there is little doubt that they will soon overcome the effect of the unfortunate start.

INDIAN

CHOSEN

Montreal, June 10.—Decoteau, the grand Alberta Indian runner, will have a plate on the city travelogue team at Stockholm. In a gruelling 5,000 metre race this afternoon he defeated Chandler, the British Columbia crack, over a wet course at the M. A. A. grounds in 15 min., 17 2/5 seconds; excellent time under adverse conditions.

The race attracted great interest in local track circles. Decoteau won the event of Saturday's Olympic trials, his only opponent being Harold Coates, of the M. A. A. A. Chandler ran in the 10,000 metres, finishing second to Keeper, of Manitoba. Decoteau started in the long stride also but collapsed in the fourth mile, only to recuperate in time to turn out and win the 5,000 metre event.

In Toronto at the Eaton meet Chandler outdistanced a big field in the 5,000 metres and put up the good mark of 15:22. Decoteau's time on Saturday was only 16:32, so it was questioned as to which man should represent Decoteau, of Alberta, who just managed to win out in 15 min., 17 2/5 secs., remarkable time for a vet day, and a heavy track. The race was a grueler from start to finish, honors being in doubt up to twenty yards from the finish, when Decoteau unrolled a grand burst of speed and flashed through the tape a winner.
