

2.—That the vote of the electors of the said Municipality of the township of the Rear of Yonge and Escott will be taken on the By-Law on Monday the fourth day of January One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nine at the same hour, on the same day, at the same places and by the same Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Cierks, as shall be appointed for holding the annual election for members of the Municipal Council of the said Municipality for the year A. D. 1908.

D. 1908, at the township town hall, Athens, at the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon the Reeve shall appoint in writing, signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this by-law.


