Blood and Slaughter, of his Divine Clemency to dispose the Minds of the Princes engaged in the Dispute to the thoughts of Peace and Concord, after they had been so long enflamed with the Rage and Fury of Arms: And whereas the most Serene and most Mighty Lady Anne, by the Grace of God, Queen of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, &c. and the most Serene and most Mighty Prince Philip the Vth, by the Grace of God, Catholick King of Spain, &c. wish for nothing more heartily, and endeavour nothing more earnestly, than that the ancient Bonds of Alliance and Friendship between the British and Spanish Nations, should not only be
