To Our Trusty and Well-Beloved Charles Eugène Panet, of Our Province of Quebec, in our Dominion of Canada.

Krow YE, that as well for the especial trust and confidence We have manifested in you, as for the purpose of obtaining your advice and assistance in all weighty and arduous affairs which may the State and Defence of our Dominion of Canada concern, We have thought fit to summon you to the Senate of Our said Dominion, and we do appoint you for the La Salle Electoral Division of Our Province of Quebec, and we do command you, the said Charles Eugène Panet, that all difficulties and excuses whatsoever laying aside, you be and appear for the purpose aforesaid in the Senate of Our said Dominion at all times whensoever and wheresoever Our Parliament may be in Our said Dominion convoked and holden; and this you are in no wise to omit.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed: WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honorable Sir Frederic Temple, Earl of Dufferin, Vicount and Baron Clandsboye, of Cla deboye, in the County Down, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baron Dufferin and Olundsboye, of Ballyleidy and Killeleagh, in the County Down, in the Peerage of Ireland, and a Buronet, Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, and Knight Commander of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor-General of Canada, and Vice-Admiral of the same. At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, in Our Dominion of Canada, this Twenty-Seventh day of March, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-four, and in the Thirtyseventh Year of Our Reign.
