 niet de se gelegenheit op gaet. Wey geven v^r hoch
 anda voor twee of drie ponten een goet aan de kroon
 Schietor te geven private en docthem de grootenpe
 van ons. Deloitt segt ons dat de Wilden in het
 Juncker Land so boos beunen op de Fr^{an}con Jonckeur
 om dat heylet Hups dat gehoken heeft dat sey goud-
 veert beunen om hem in het Voorjaer wey te jagen
 waer toe v^r ook v^r best moet doen onder de Wilden
 wey deuden v^r een Brandt Sawant daer voor in dat v^r
 met haer salt spreken om dat te te verleggen
 daer sy belooft hebben.

The Interpreter being come from Canajoharie brought
 Abelt of Wampum from the Sachins there to assure the
 Com^{rs} That they are resolved to keep the Peace with the
 Southern Indians and not follow y^e Example of y^e other
 Nations. He also says that an Onondage Indian came
 Theres Last Week to Inform the Sachin there That a party
 of 80 Onondages Onydes 8. Who went to fight Last fall to
 the Southern had Engaged with a party of English at the
 Back of Virginia & that Eight English were killed & that
 but 4 of the 80 Indians were Returned

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He also says that a party of 9 French Indians who went
 to fight to the Southward & came there to Engage some of y^e
 Canajoharie Indians to go with them which he the Interpreter
 opposed one of our Indians told him that they were sent
 out to fight by John Lindens at y^e Carryngplace who
 had given them 2 Bells of wampum to Engage to go
 our Indians to go with them & asked him why he would
 hinder. While one of our own Government had sent them
 out. But that none of our Indians went with them

 Rumor going again to Crown point upon Com^{rs} business
