The notice calling for tenders asked for the price that would be paid for the different kinds of timber over and above Grown dues payable thereon under the Timber Regulations of the Department.

Instead of your tender being higher than others, it was lower on every kind of timber than that of the successful fenderer.

Your quotations with dues added as shown above are not correct, viz:- Basswood \$14.00, was only \$15.00; Hemlook \$10.50, was only \$9.50; Cedar \$10.00 was only \$9.
