Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo, enclosing copy of a letter from the Chief of the Port Alexander Band requesting permission for 34 Members of the Band to cut and sell Spruce and Poplar logs to any person or persons, who own a Saw Mill inside the Reserve, and in reply to inform you that if there is abundance of timber on the Reserve to admit of cutting so much, you may give permits to cut 24 logs each, subject to payment of dues under sworn returns; unless you consider that they are not in a position to pay, and that the case is one for relief.

I have to request you to send all outstanding statements of timber cut on this Reserve.

There is an item of 1,000 cords authorized to be taken out in January, 1914, and
