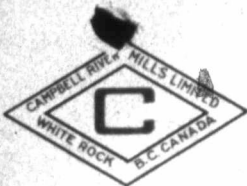

Under date of January 1, 1914, we leased from the Department of Indian Affairs certain lands; a part of the Semiahmoo Indian Reserve at White Rock. This lease was for 21 years and still has 10 years to run.

We are about to negotiate a loan in connection with our business in the way of debenture bonds and we, therefore, find it necessary to either have the deed to the land or a longer lease. First, we would like to purchase the land covered by this lease but if this is impossible and you can not grant us this privilege can we have an extension to the lease of 15 to 20 years.

We are particularly anxious to negotiate this loan during August, therefore, your consideration of this matter and a reply will be greatly appreciated.
