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Egyptian darkness. It would be about as sensible to ignore God in these events of history, as it would be to deny His government of the physical universe. When Orangemen speak of the victories that were achieved at Enniskillen, Aughrim, Derry, and the Boyne, they emphatically re-assert the principles which have rendered the Revolution of 1688-90 forever memorable.

On the 1st of July, 1690, there lay the twoarmies with the river Boyne between them. The signal was given, and the English army dashed into the river. A shout rose from the Irish army, and they rushed madly for the battle. William's army pressed forward to the The Irish began to waver. opposite bank. His best Tyrconnel looked on in despair, officers were slain, or wounded or captured. Schomberg and other brave men fell on the Protestant side, but William still rode on in front of his brave troops, cheering them on to victory, The battle was short, sharp, decisive; the day was won. Two thousand of the Irish lay dead on the field or in the river, and about 500 of the
