And the foil is rich and fertile, naturally producing all fuch Commodities as Its Rivers. are found in New-England or Virginia, which fball be next created of, as The Suil. alfo doth abound in the fame forts of Beafts and Fowl, both tame and wild, Fifb, Fruits, Plants, Roots, Herbs, Gums, Trees, Balfoms, de. But the general trade of this Province depends chiefly upon Tobacco, which being effected better for a Foreign Markes then that of Virginia, finds great vent abroad, Their trade. and the Planter at home, in exchange thereof, is furnished by the Merchane, with all neceffaries for himfelf, his Houfe, Family, and Plantation.

The Natives of this Province, as to their flature, complexion, cuftoms, difofitions, laws, religions, apparel, dyes, honfes, de.are much the fame with those of New-England and Firginia, and are also of different Tribes, or forts of People, and each governed by their particular King.

This Province of Mary-land, his Majefty K. Charles the Firft, in Anno 1632, granted by Patent to the Right Honorable Caciling Calvert , Lord Lord Bald-Baltemore, and to his Heirs and Affigns, and by that Patent created him, tor of Ming. and them, the true and abfolute Lords and Proprietors of the fame (faving land. the Allegiance and Soveraign Dominion due to his Majefty, his Heirs, and Succeffors;) thereby likewife granting to them all Royal Jurisdictions and Prerogatives, both Military and Givil ; as power of enacting Laws, Marsial Laws, making of War and Peace, pardoning of offences, conferring of bonours, coyning of money, dre. and in acknowledgment thereof, yielding and paying yearly to his Majefty, his Heirs, and Succeffors, two Indian arrows at Windfor-Caftle in Barkfbire, on Eafter Tuefaay, together with the fifth part of all the Gold and Silver-ore that shall be there found. And for the better. inviting of people to fettle here, his Lord/bip, by advice of the General Affembly of that Province, hath long fince eftablished a Model of good and wholfome Laws, for the eafe and tienefit of the Inhabitants, with toleration of Religion to all forts that profess the Faith of Christ ; which hath been a principal motive to many to fettle under that Government; rather then in another where liberty of Confcience is denyed them.

This Province, where peopled by the English, is fevered into ten Coun- is division ties, to wit, five Eaftwards of Che jopeak-bay, as Cecil, Dorchefter, Kent, Somerfet, and Talbot ; and five Weftwards of the faid Bay, as Ann-Arundel, Baltemore, Calvert, Charles, and St. Maries ; And in every one of thefe Counties there is held an inferiour Gunt every first un other of final inat-ters, from which there lyeth Appeals to the province held at St. Ma-ries. The Inhabitants being at prefent about 16000, have begun to build fe- its inhabiveral Towns, which in few years 'tis hoped may come to four perfection, as tanis and Calverton, Herrington, and Harvy-Town, all commodioufly feated for the benefit of erade and conveniency of fbipping, but above all is St. Maries, feated on St. Georges River, beautified with well-built Houfes, is the place where the Governour (his Lordships Son and Heir Mr. Charles Calvert )hath his Houfe, though at prefent he refide that Massepany, about 8 miles diftant, and where the General Aftembly and Provincial Courses are held, and publick Offices kept.
