SEFTEMBER.—Some observations made by Professor Buckland of University College, Toronto, in a letter to the Canada Furmer in 1866, are svery important that we give them a place here. They will apply to many parts of Canada as truly as to any portions of Lambton. He say "Drainage is the great work that must be accomplished ere this naturally rich section of country can have its great agricultural abilitie fully developed. An outfall in some places will be difficult to obtain and requires the hearty co-operation of many proprietors of land. The improvement of nature's drainage by removing all obstructions from creeks and water courses, and cutting open ditches through the lower and wetter portions of the land, would soon relieve large areas of stagnant and injurious water, and ultimately prepare for more refined and elaborate systems of underdraining.
