# British and Foreign.

Oscar, king of Sweden and Norwsy, has left London and arrived at Paris, where he will visit the exposition.

The reports of merchandise from the United States during April reached \$40,000,000, the greatest for any one month in our history.

Hot. J. I. Tarte, Canada's Commis-sioner at the Paris Exposition, caples that the Canadian exhibition will be closed on Sundays.

The Boer Commissioners have decided upon an extended tour of the United States, and will start on their trip from Washington probably going to Boston and thence to the west.

The American Republican convention takes place at Philadelphia this week. Mr. McKinley and Mr. Roosevelt are the strongest candidates apparently for nomination as President and Vicepresident.

The Established Church of Scotland Assembly was opened with the usual ceremonial. Earl Leven and Melville represented the Queen. Dr. Norman Macleod of Inverness was elected moderator. Rev. Jacob Primmer was not allowed to at end the communion service, as he intended to protest against it as illegal. Rev. Mr. McKenzie, the leader of the secession from the Free Church when the D claratory Act was adopted, was received by the Assembly as a minister of the Church of Scotland. Four other applicants were received. the funds of the church all show to good advantage.
