DRIFTING SAND WHICH SHOWS THE NEED OF A FORESTRY POLICY IN DURHAM CO., ONT.

This great sand hill is practically being removed by the action of the wind. The wind for the past few months has prevailed mostly from the south-west. The drifted sand, as shown, is the work only of the last few months. It is blocking the road, the sand being many feet deep. At one time this was a passable highway. When the photo was taken last week by an editorial representative of Farm and Dairy, there was little wind blowing, yet this sand was drifting like snow. Not content with filling the cut in the road, the sand is continuing its course in the orchard beyond owned by Mr. J. D. Tobble, and is working destruction there.
