Terrible Battle Being Waged Tampico Is Scene of Desperate Conflict Between Federals and Rebels TOWN IS IN FLAMES

Attacking Gunners Guided by Lurid Flames Flung Projectiles Into Town, with Deadly Accuracy. (By Leased Wire to the Journal of Commerce.) Tampico, Mexico, May 11.—According to reports received here by constitutional officers last night, a terrible battle, the most desperate of the present revolution, is being fought at Tampico. Some of the oil wells and tanks are burning, and a large portion of the town is a mass of flames.

Are On Even Terms. For the first time in the fighting between Huertista and Carranza, the constitutionalists were on equal terms with the federalists in artillery.

Seize Lighthouses. (By Leased Wire to the Journal of Commerce.) Mexico City, May 11.—Foreign Minister Ruiz has telegraphed the South American mediators in Washington that several United States torpedo boats with a transport and other vessels have appeared off the coast of Mexico between Vera Cruz and Tampico, landed a party on the island and arrested the lighthouse attendants, who were released after they had turned over the instruments and apparatus for operating the lighthouse.

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MORE EARTHQUAKES IN OTHER PARTS OF SICILY Latest Shock Felt At Randazzo on the North Western Slope of Mount Etna—Inhabitants Are In a Panic CASUALTIES STILL UNKNOWN

Great Heat Which Prevails Aggravates Suffering of Victims and Makes Work of Rescue More Difficult, Necessitating Immediate Burial—Railway Communication is Completely Interrupted—King and Queen Go To Sicily. Rome, May 11.—Further earth shocks were felt in Sicily yesterday, but in a different part than the one of Friday last which caused the death of over 150 people. The latest shock was felt severely at Randazzo, on the northwestern slope of Mount Etna. There was a panic among the 10,000 inhabitants. It is not known if there were any casualties.
