SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS The sole head of a family, or any male ter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duttes—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine mines of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section flourside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent, also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead tent on certain conditions. ditions.

A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-stead in cretain districts. Price \$3.00 per
