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## MINERS ARE ACCUSED

Dying Sheriff Says Western Federation Instigated Outrage.

Was Blown Up by Bomb at His Front Gate—Idaho Outrage Re-called—Had Been Followed for Weeks—Victim Arrested Notorious Steve Adams and Was Witness Against Him.

Baker City, Oregon, Oct. 3.—The Western Federation of Miners was accused of instigating the death of Harvey K. Brown, formerly sheriff of this county, in an ante-mortem statement made by the victim Tuesday afternoon. Brown was blown up by a bomb as he was entering his front gate late Monday evening, the outrage being in many respects similar to that which destroyed former Governor Steunenberg of Idaho. The ante-mortem statement reads:

"I was on my way home from up-town last night, when I met a man in front of a residence which is a block away from my house, and spoke. The man made no reply. This man was about 5 feet 10 inches tall; his weight was 165 pounds. He wore a brown suit and a celluloid collar, and was clean-shaven. I have been conscious of having been followed for three weeks, and I have no doubt that those who attempted my life are persons connected with the Western Federation of Miners, on account of my connection with the Steunenberg and Steve Adams cases."

Brown arrested Steve Adams at Haines when the latter was wanted as a witness in the Steunenberg case, and he testified at the trial of Adams in Wallace, when the latter faced a jury on the charge of having murdered a claim-jumper.

**NO WORK FOR DOCTORS.**

Health Officers Will Prevent Disease in Time to Come.

London, Oct. 3.—The change the practice of medicine is undergoing was the keynote of several addresses made by leading London doctors at the opening of the winter session of the medical schools connected with the London hospitals.

The speakers said the day was coming when the doctors in private practice would disappear and be replaced by the public health officer, whose work would be in the prevention rather than in the cure of disease.

Dr. Ewart told the students that the profession was in the throes of a double crisis, economical and professional. He declared that the growing success in reducing the prevalence of disease and the growth of the public health service had contracted the field of general practice and the process was bound to continue. He said it was inevitable that the profession should become more and more the servant of the state. Henceforth its members must devote themselves to the culture of health preventing instead of curing disease.

Other addresses of a similar nature were heard, one physician contending that things were moving toward the unique consummation of a calling by its own training and application, destroying the very source upon which it depended for its living.

**GORED BY MAD BULL.**

Western Fair Director Receives Terrible Injuries.

London, Oct. 3.—Mr. Charles Trebilcock, the well-known Western Fair director, was terribly injured yesterday morning by a mad bull on his farm in London Township, to the rear of the asylum grounds.

Mr. Trebilcock was leading to bull from the barn when it attacked him. Its horns penetrated his abdomen, and he was caught upon its horns.

A neighbor who heard Mr. Trebilcock's cry for help came to his rescue, and after pulling Mr. Trebilcock from its horns he beat it back.

Dr. Stevenson was called and found Mr. Trebilcock to have been frightfully torn about the abdomen. He hopes that he will recover.

**Would Admit Limited Number.**

Vancouver, B. C., Oct. 3.—While urging the Dominion Government to aid in the immigration of such classes as will at all times insure the predominance of the white race, the Vancouver Board of Trade Tuesday night favored the admission of a limited number of Asiatics for a limited number of years under suitable restrictions to relieve the present situation.

The steamer Tremont, a Japanese vessel, has nearly 300 more Japs.

**Dies in Poverty.**

New York, Oct. 3.—The newspapers yesterday report the death and obsequies of William Francis Carey, who was a wealthy Wall street operator until the recent slump in stocks. Mr. Carey, who at one time had a home in Madison avenue, where he entertained extensively, ended his days in lodgings and almost in utter poverty. It is stated that he died just before his death he was seeking employment by the day, though at one time he enjoyed an income of about \$300,000 a year.

**Safe Opened, Cash Missing.**

Ottawa, Oct. 3.—A mysterious affair occurred Monday night last at the residence of Hon. John G. Foster, the American consul-general, who lives at 267 O'Connor street.

A safe was opened by someone who managed to work the combination successfully, and it is said \$200 in cash is missing. There is no clue.

**Captures Live Deer.**

Lindsay, Oct. 3.—A live deer has been captured by William Shields, near Janetville, and he has the animal now in his barn. It followed his cattle home, where it was caught by two men stealing up behind it and grabbing it by the hind legs.
