Retraction And Apology

The Planet has received a notice from Messrs. Johnston, McKay, Dods and Grant, of Toronto, solicitors for Mrs. Mattie Perkins, complaining of certain statements which appeared in our Daily Planet of February 20th, 23rd and 27th regarding what was known as the Canfield Poisoning Case.

The reports in question were not written by any member of The Planet's staff, but were received from a news agency in Toronto and accepted in good faith and without malice to any one. We had no way of verifying the truthfulness of these reports no more than we have of verifying hundreds of other reports received in despatches every week. To have to verify everything of this character on a moment's notice would practically prohibit the publication of a daily newspaper.

In the light of the evidence submitted at the trial, however, these reports appear unfounded, and we have only to express our deep regret that they should have appeared in our columns, and to tender Mrs. Perkins an apology. Mrs. Perkins is quite unknown to the publisher, as she is, doubtless, to our readers, and this statement being given equal prominence to that which the reports complained of received, we trust it will be accepted in the spirit in which it is extended—that of regret at having unconsciously done her injustice.

Through the same legal firm notice of complaint has also been served on behalf of Messrs. Ralph Currie—brother of Mrs. Perkins—and Thomas A. McDonald, of Canfield, with regard to matter which appeared in The Daily Planet of February 21st. As in the case of Mrs. Perkins above referred to, we unreservedly withdraw and express regret for the references complained of by these gentlemen, and so far as The Planet is concerned, clear them completely in the matter.

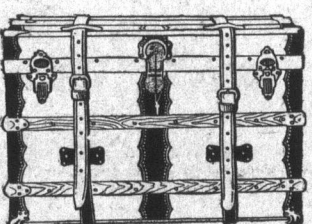
