Havana, Sept. 21.—The leaders of the revolutionary movement have call-ed all the generals in the field to a conference in Havana. They are safe from molestation during the truce.

tions in the Cuban conflict has not enable Secretary of War Taft and Assistant Secretary Bacon to announce any plan for compromising the difficulty.

So strenuous are the appeals of both the Liberal and Moderate party leaders that the situation becomes increasing

that the situation becomes increasing-ly complicated as the negotiations pro-ceed. However, Secretary Taft said last night that he believed that when they are brought face to face with the dan-ger of losing independence forever all patriotic Cubans will be willing to

Mr. Taft has made it clear that the United States is not seeking to exercise control over the island or any of its affairs; but he has quoted President Roosevelt's letter to Minister Quesada to the effect that the United States has a duty which it cannot shirk. To those whom he has met in conference Mr. Taft has said that now is the time to decide whether they would have

Cuba live as a nation.

No reports of disturbances anywhere on the island were received yesterday. Clenfuegos is suffering from a water famine on account of destruction of the waterworks at Jicotea by the insurgents.

How the Great Penguin Hatches. It may interest you to know that the great penguin of the southern cir-cle standing with its head as high as a man's waist, hatches its eggs in a peculiar manner. These are not laid upon the ground and brooded on after the manner of most birds' eggs. The female lays two large eggs. The first she hands over to the male bird, the other she keeps. The egg is held on the upper surface of the large flat feet, and is pushed up under the waistcoat of thick feathers. It is there held close to the body, whose warmth gradually vitalizes the young bird. So tenacious are the parent birds of this grip that if you knock one of them over it will fall on its back with its feet stuck stiffly out, stiff clutching the egg to its body.
