"OUT OF THE FOG"

**New Brunswick Teachers Association
Opens Its Membership to All Holders of
Teachers Licenses in New Brunswick**

Will Give the Teachers One Big Organization to Enforce Their Salary and Other Demands—Dr. B. C. Foster, the President, Reviews Growth of Association and What It Has Accomplished—A. S. McFarlane Praised for His Energetic Work as Secretary—Reports of Progress in Various Districts—Charles B. Stillman, President of the American Federation of Teachers, Advocates Affiliation With Organized Labor.

The New Brunswick Teachers' Association at their meeting here last night in connection with the biennial session of the Educational Institute of New Brunswick decided to open the membership to all teachers holding licenses.

Membership had previously been restricted to the holders of the higher classes of licenses, and practically every teacher in the province eligible has held membership in the association, which has been active in bringing about an increase in the salaries of teachers.

No action was taken on the proposal to have the organization become associated with the American Federation of Teachers, whose president, Charles B. Stillman, of Chicago, was present and advocated such action, which would mean affiliation with the American Federation of Labor.

The Chairman's Address.
Dr. B. C. Foster presided and in his opening address traced the growth of the association from the time when there were but 50 teachers enrolled until the present day, when it includes practically all the higher class teachers of the province. The organization had been well received by the public press and the board of trustees of the Board of Education and trustees throughout the province.

The speaker stated that the report received by the members and now an association was well under way without friction. Two meetings of the executive had been held, and at these the schedule of salaries for the teachers had been drawn up and sent to trustees, teachers and the press throughout the province. While all praise was due the association in connection with the increases it was not claimed that the organization had done all the work.

Continuing, Dr. Foster stated that it would be well for all teachers to communicate in future with the various secretaries in order that better regulated schedules might be drafted.

Success so far had been due to (1) the organization; (2) the zeal and activity of the members; and (3) the hearty co-operation of the teachers.

The upturning efforts of the secretary-treasurer, A. S. McFarlane, of Fredericton, Dr. Foster stated that the association had so far justified its existence and that its objects were: To act in harmony with the educational authorities of the province to bring about better conditions, to try by all legitimate means to raise the standard of the salaries, to unite the teachers more in the province, to obtain an adequate pension scheme in order to give more permanence to the profession. Regarding pensions the committee which was appointed to interview the Government was sympathetically received and the only reason no action was taken was because of the nearness to the time of proroguing.

SNAPSHOTS DEVELOPED AND PRINTED

**ENGINEER KILLED
AT EDMUNDSTON**

(Special despatch to The Daily Gleaner.)

Edmundston, N. B., June 29.—There occurred yesterday, in the C. P. R. yards here, an accident in which Bert Gardiner, a locomotive engineer, lost his life. According to the most reliable account, while the Edmundston locomotive was being made up, Mr. Gardiner left the locomotive in charge of a substitute while he went for a supply of tobacco. While on a rear fire car, he thought that part of the train was moving too fast, and ran to apply the brake to prevent too strong a collision with another string of cars. He was too late, however, and the car threw him down between two cars, which continued to move a short distance, passing over the engineer's body. Although not immediately fatal, the injuries received proved so in the end. Mr. Gardiner, who resided at Woodstock, is survived by a wife and three children.
