At 12 o'clock the convention was visited by Hons. Messrs. Bowell, Foster and Costigan, and M. Adams, Esq. The Chairman then presented the unanimous nomination of the convention to M. Adams, Esq.

Mr. Adams on receiving the nomination, expressed himself as being much gratified by the unanimous nomination of the convention and stated that he would enter into the contest with all his power and he had faith that he would be successful. Referred to the policy of Sir John's Government, and to what it had done for the country in the past. It might be considered selfish in us to ask in what regard could the Liberal party have done better for our interests and welfare than has been done by the Liberal-Conservative Government. He should endeavor to be studious when elected, so that he might worthily represent this county of Northumberland. The canvass should be conducted by him on a broad and sound basis, treating everybody with courtesy, discussing the policy of the Government without indulging in personalities. The question to be considered should be—there are two parties—Liberal Conservative and Liberal, and we must go one or the other, and we ask the people to use their judgment as to what is best for their interest, and taking no account of what personal charges may be brought against him, but what was for their best interests. He thanked them heartily for their nomination. He would now give way to his friends—members of Sir John's Government, as he would have other opportunities of addressing them at a future time. The Chairman then in a few well chosen remarks introduced the Hon. McKenzie Bowell, Minister of Customs, who replied. He said it pleased him to be present on the occasion and judging from the personal appearance of the delegates, they appeared to be a fair representative assembly, and he felt sure they had done the right thing in nominating so strong a man as their candidate. The Liberals seek power without any grand principle at stake, having one policy for one Province and a different one for another. To successfully govern a country we should know neither creed or country, but to be Canadian first and always, or our policy would not be upheld by the people of Canada. Personal abuse was the great plank of the Liberal platform, while Sir John's Government worked in the interest of the whole country. He was pleased to be present on this occasion, and to meet so many gentlemen from different parts of this country. Hon. Mr. Foster was pleased to meet with the convention, and was glad to learn that they had been so unanimous. He referred in complimentary terms to Mr. Adams. As he was to speak in the afternoon he would give place to Mr. Costigan.

Mr. Costigan said this was the first time he had the pleasure of addressing the people in any portion of the county of Northumberland. He was personally acquainted with Mr. Adams, and he must congratulate them in nominating so strong a candidate, and he looked for a Liberal-Conservative victory in the coming contest. He thought Mr. Adams would do his duty and get for Northumberland what she was entitled to. As he would not say much now, as it would lessen his ammunition for that time.
