The following bye-law. entitled "A Bye-Law to regulate the style and class of buildings to be erected and to define and create a portion of the Town of Campbellton a fire district" was adopted.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Campbellton,
That the following described portion or part of the Town of Campbellton, embraced within the part of the Town lping east of Sugar Loaf Street, north of the Intercolouial Railway, extending easterly to the Junction of King Street with Cedar Street, thence continuing easterly along King Street, including all that portion of the Town lying north of King St. to Ramsay St. on the Restigouche River, be and is erection of framed buildings exceeding 25 feet in height from the street level, and the use of shingle roofs to be prohibited in said Fire District.

Any person or persons guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bye-law shall upon conviction before the Police or other Magistrate within the Town, or for refusing to comply with or shall undertake to envade the same, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Dollars for each and every infraction thereof.
