But it was no use, Mr. Macdonald had other interests to serve than the convenience of the people of the district, and the necessity of his political position forced him, in the face of right and justice, to fix the location of the registry office wherehis friendship would be appreciated and where the paltry bestowal of an almost insignificant public building could influsoce a few votes, more or less, to send to Parliament a follower of the Patent Combination, which is now receiling and staggering at the incertitude already besetting its members at the approaching session of the New House.

Mr. Macdonald, as is well known, is not very choice in his language, and the elevation of his position adds nothing to his graceful diction. —He confronted the deputation who had persistently urged upon him the claims of Strathroy, with the exclanation, "What the h—II has Strathroy done for me?"


