A chaplain, aged fifty-six, although himself severely burned, carried wounded men from the battery deck to the distributing station.

One surgeon amputated a limb single-handed in the dark; another sev erely wounded, had to be compulsorily placed on the sick list; another worked on a deck flooded with a foot of water; another worked for forty hours without rest.

Several officers and men perform ed gallant deeds in scalding steam and suffocating fumes. One officer remained at work until swelling from burns closed his eyes and his hands were useless.
