Nfld. Scotch Cured Herring.

Although there are sales reported as low as \$18 for Scotch cured herring in New York, and, indeed, there are reports of sales of inferior goods as low as \$16 the market has developed a little stronger during the past week, and if the inquiries from domestic sources can be taken as an indication of future business, there is reasonable expectation that the late spring and early summer season will be more active. Some factors in New York holding stocks of fancy quality Newfoundland herring are quoting at \$24, and sales of small lots of these goods are reported at prices up to \$23 per barrel. The situation is not by any means normal, however, and it is the prevailing opinion in the trade that the inferior quality of the usual run of Scotch cured herring from this source has more than anything else depressed the market. There are considerable stocks held in Newfoundland still, and offerings continue to come from Halifax and Montreal. This has had a further weakening effect on the market. But in spite of these adverse circumstances, it appears that there is a better feeling in the trade. Those who hold stocks of good quality herring are inclined to be bullish, while those holding inferior herring display an anxiety to sell. The practice of offering goods in selections of sizes has again come into vogue, and sales of small lots of large fish this week have almost invariably been accompanied by sales of small fish. In other words the trade is not willing to sell large fish only, or to give buyers the option to pick a few barrels from a number. The small jobbers have been buying from hand-to-mouth during the past few months, none carrying more than a week's supply at a time. Winter and Spring herring is not in demand and prices continue weak.—N. Y. Fishing Gazette, April 19.

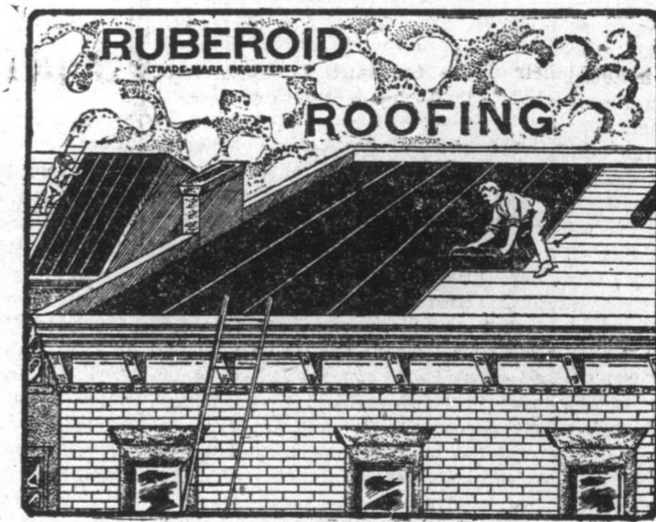
