More Paper Issue.

Moscow.—The Russian State Bank is contemplating an issue of its own bank notes to meet the general shortage of currency, particularly in the provinces. The Rosta (news agency) announces that the bank has been directed by the Finance Commissariat to work out an emission plan.

Poles Look to Canada.

Warsaw.—The stoppage of emigration to the United States has turned the Polish emigrant tide toward Canada, according to reports of Danzig steamship officials here. At the same time the number of immigrants returning to Poland from America continues to increase. The total of incoming and outgoing emigrants passing through Danzig in 1921 was 140,000 as compared with 126,000 in 1920.

"Tartar" is a lime-like substance that forms on the teeth. It is composed of saliva, phosphate of lime, etc., and becomes attached to the teeth near the salivary duct. It is porous like a sponge and holds particles of food which decompose and taint the breath with an offensive odor. This tartar once formed increases, always in the direction of the gums; first inflaming them, then causing them to puff up and recede from the teeth, and finally by absorption of the bony sockets, to cause good, sound teeth to drop out for want of support.

The staff photographer of an English newspaper, wearing a top hat and bearing a beautiful leather valise, presented himself at the Bronze Gates when the crush was at its height. "No cameras allowed in," the huge Swiss Guard informed him, in a tone of finality. "Camera, nothing," responded the photographer haughtily, "this is a medicine case. Please let me pass that I may render aid to the injured inside." Pass right in, doctor," the Swiss Guard said, humbly.

CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL.

Constantinople (A.P. Mail)—A children's hospital, said to be the largest in the world, has just been opened at Alexandropol, in the Southern Caucasus. It is under the direction of Dr. R. T. Uhis, of Pittsburg, Mass., and has been financed entirely with funds from America by the Near East Relief. The hospital at present has 2,700 beds, housed in 40 wards, but when fully completed next May it will hold 6,000 beds. The child patients are drawn from six Russian, Armenian and Greek provinces, occupying an area larger than New England, and are all suffering from trachoma, a malignant eye disease which has become the scourge of child-life in this part of the world.
